COVID SAFETY GUIDELINES



Residents should wear sterile gloves or conduct hand sanitation when filling their candy dishes / bowls / etc.

✓ Military Spouse Licensure Reimbursement

- Spouses who PCS from one duty station to another are eligible to apply for Spouse Licensure Reimbursement
 - To apply for the reimbursement up to \$1,000 the military member will submit supporting documents to their unit S-1 as follows:
 - Copy of current PCS Orders
 - Verification of spouse's license number, type of license, and state
 - Copy of new state license and/or certification
 - Proof of fees paid for relicensing and/or recertification from current duty station

IMPACT AID & MILITARY CONNECTED STUDENTS

• Impact Aid is a federal program that provides funding for a portion of the educational cost of federal-connected students. It recaptures money lost from federal land located within the districts' boundaries that is exempt from property taxes (up to \$3000 per student).

IMPACT AID FUNDING

• School district's Impact Aid payments are based in part on the count of federally connected including military children who attend schools in the district. The money is not designated for individual children.

HOW IMPACT AID SUPPORTS MILITARY STUDENTS

 Impact Aid is the only federal education program where funds are sent directly to the school districts. The funds go directly into the school district's general fund for operations such as the purchase of textbooks, computers, utilities, and payment of staff salaries. It helps offset the cost to educate students who live on exempt property.

IMPORTANCE OF RETURNING THE IMPACT AID FORM

• Every year, schools send home an Impact Aid form or an online survey for parents to complete, sign and return. This form counts the number of federally impacted students in the school district to apply for available money. Schools send this survey home anytime from the fourth day of school to January 31.





Updated Pharmacy Procedures

The Pharmacy Provider Inbox used to expedite patient Rx Activation for acute and non-acute medication requests has been decommissioned as of FRIDAY 1 October 2021 and will no longer be available for patient prescription activation or acute care prescription requests.

RX ACTIVATION

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<u>Two ways for patients to self-activate their prescriptions!</u>

- 1. Save Time ACTIVATE ONLINE! Patients can still utilize Tricare Online to activate their refill and new prescriptions (24 hour turn-around time).
- 2. Patients can Self-Activate an Rx placed on their prescription profile by their WBAMC Provider Care team, by going to any of the pharmacies below and selecting activate new or renewal Rx at the pharmacy kiosk for a SAME DAY PICK-UP OPTION :
 - Main Pharmacy 7:30am-4:30pm M-F
 - Mendoza Clinic Pharmacy 7:30am-4:30pm M-F
 - Stast Bliss Clinic Pharmacy 7:30am-4:00pm M-F
 - Streedom Crossing Pharmacy 9:30am-6:00pm M-F

*Pharmacy asks that staff utilize the Tricare Online option for Rx Activation of any non-acute medication request to expedite their pharmacy trip!



COVID-19 Third Dose and Boosters Vaccines

- William Beaumont Army Medical Center is now administering third dose and booster vaccines of the Pfizer –BioNTech/COMIRNATY COVID-19 vaccine.
- TRICARE beneficiaries, who wish to receive a third dose or booster of the vaccine, can call the appointment line at 915-742-2273 or go to www.tricareonline.com to make an appointment.
- Vaccines are administered at Stout Gym on Fort Bliss. Appointments are preferred however, walk-ins are accepted. All patients are asked to bring their CDC COVID vaccine card and government identification for verification. Stout Gyms walk-in hours are Monday – Friday 0900-1500. Saturday and Sunday begin at 0900 but they will close operations early if volumes are not high.
- Third dose vaccines are for those who are moderately or severely immunocompromised. Patients wishing to get the third dose can do so after <u>28 days</u> from their second dose of the Pfizer BioNTECH/COMIRNATY vaccine series.
- Booster vaccines are for those who are 18 years old and older, and who had a two-dose series of the Pfizer BioNTech/COMIRNATY. The booster vaccine can be taken <u>six months</u> after the second dose.
- WBAMC is also administering booster vaccines to frontline health care workers, provided that they are TRICARE beneficiaries. WBAMC staff are also authorized to receive a booster dose.



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


COVID Testing Site – Overseas PCS

HOURS: Monday – Saturday 0800-1200. Closed Sundays, Federal Holidays and Fort Bliss DONSAs.






THIS SITE IS FOR COVID SWAB COLLECTION ONLY, NOT MEDICAL ASSESSMENT.







BBC – Reminders

- Bonfires and Fire pits
- ✓ Bonfires are not permitted

✓ Fire Pits

Portable fire pits are permitted if the following safety guidelines are followed:

- Fire pit must comply with Installation Fire Safety Code. Residents must contact Fire Prevention for an inspection of the fire pit and required equipment.
- Fire pit cannot be used within 30 feet of a structure or under any type of overhang or trees.
- Fire pit MUST have a screen to prevent sparks from escaping. Open fires are NOT permitted.
- Fires must be kept small and under control.
- Fire and Emergency Services personnel may determine at any time that a fire needs to be extinguished.
- Fire pit use is prohibited during extreme fire hazard conditions, to include local burn bans and high winds.
- Resident are required to keep a fire extinguisher at the fire pit as well as one inside the home.
- A fully operational garden hose must be readily available to extinguish spot fires.
- Firewood should be stored a minimum of twenty-two (22) feet from any buildings to protect homes from termites.
- When not in use, fire pits should be stored in the fenced portion of the back yard or garage (where available), not in the driveway or at the side of the home.
- Residents are responsible for all damages and/or injuries resulting from the use of such equipment and liable for the associated costs incurred.
