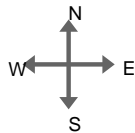

Improved Wait Times -Both the main hospital outpatient pharmacy and the Mendoza pharmacy are averaging overall visit times of less than 15 minutes down from an hour (measured from time the ticket is pulled to the time Rx's are dispensed and beneficiaries are on their way out the door)

The first week of April the Freedom Crossing pharmacy will begin streamlining their workflows with the same goal of improving customer wait times.

Coming Soon- Avoid the Lines

Script Center- An alternative refill pickup location option for our Tricare beneficiaries. Refills can be requested through either the refill line or the online system. The Script Center will be a set of pharmacy lockers located at Freedom Crossing. Beneficiaries can create a Script Center account and log-in to the device to directly pick up their refills.



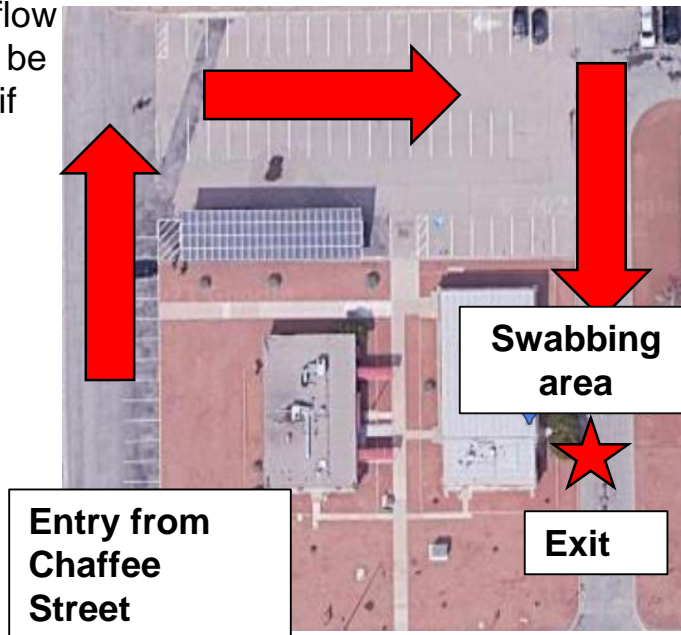


COVID Testing Site – 1029 Chaffee

LOCATION: Building 1029 Chaffee Road. From Cassidy gate, take a right onto Pleasanton. The building turn in will be on your left at the Family Behavior Health Building. If you pass Bradley Road, you have passed it. There will be signs with a RED arrows starting at the entry.

HOURS: Monday – Saturday 0800-1200. Closed Sundays, Federal Holidays and Fort Bliss DONSA's.

An overflow lane will be opened if needed.



THIS SITE IS FOR COVID SWAB COLLECTION ONLY, NOT MEDICAL ASSESSMENT.

This site will test Soldiers that are traveling OCONUS for a PCS, TDY or leave. Medical Orders do not have to be placed prior to arrival, but the SM must bring a copy of the travel orders or leave form and military ID.



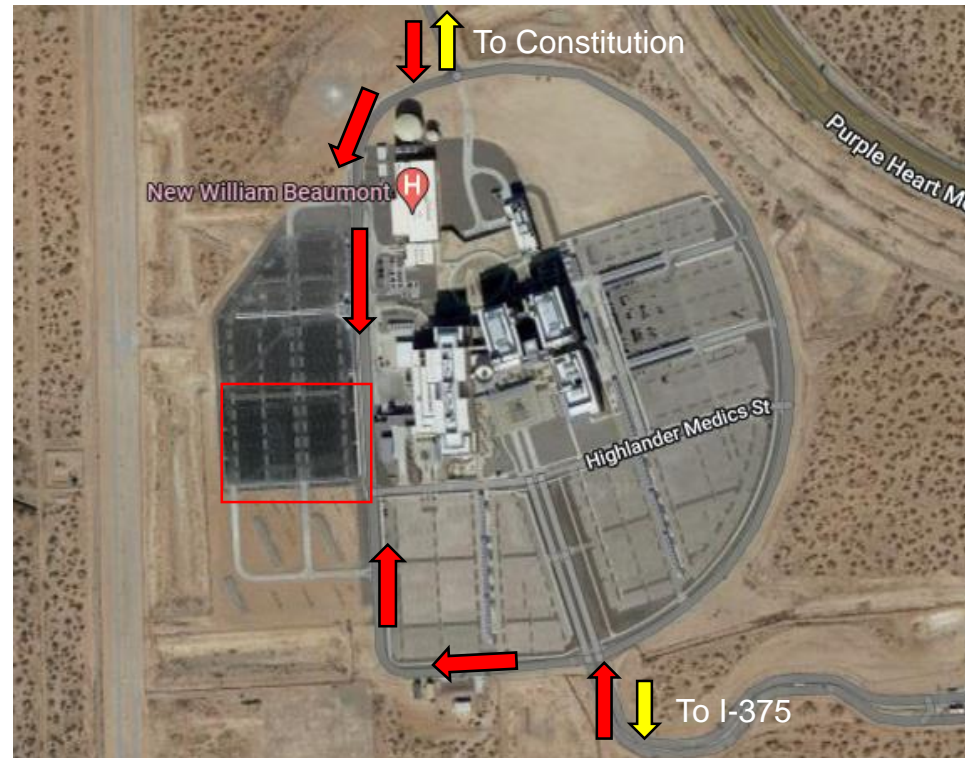


COVID-19 Testing Site- WBAMC

COVID -19 VACCINES

William Beaumont Army Medical Center continues to administer doses of the Pfizer – BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines.

Vaccines are administered at Milam Gym on Fort Bliss. Walk-ins are accepted. All patients are asked to bring their CDC COVID vaccine card and government identification for verification.

Vaccines are available for 12 years old and older at Milam gym. Mendoza Pediatric clinic has vaccine doses available for 5-11 years old.

WBAMC is also administering booster vaccines to TRICARE beneficiaries, including WBAMC employees.

HOURS: MON- FRI 0900-1500



COVID SELF-TEST KITS

Home test kits are now available for distribution for Tricare beneficiaries at Milam gym.

Limited to 8 tests / 30 day period.

✓ Ft. Bliss Mosquito Surveillance

- 15890 mosquitoes were collected in 2021, 9000 plus females were tested for arboviruses.
- 584 Aedes Aegypti females were tested for ZIKA, Chikungunya, Dengue and Yellow Fever, all were negative.
- **38 Trap site's produced 38 positive WNV** infected pools of mosquitoes in 2021 on Ft. Bliss and all Ft. Bliss property, not included in the El Paso, city, county area.
- 2021 increased in positive pools of WNV from 2020, factors included more rainfall last year.
- Increased surveillance and treatments were successful
- DPW needs to continue keeping ditches and ponding areas free of trash and debris an maintain good vegetation control.

✓ **Ft. Bliss Mosquito Surveillance**

- Sets 26 traps weekly in housing areas, ranges and offices
- Send collected samples to APHC-Central for testing
- Submit work order to Pride for treatment based on surveillance and resurvey treated areas
- Gave mosquito control measures to Balfour Beatty office for dissemination to their resident
- Use mosquito repellents if working out doors
- Encourage installation of screens on all windows
- Attend tristate quarterly meetings
- Maintain close coordination between PM, DPW-E and contractor along with El Paso Health Department and the Texas Department of Health Services.

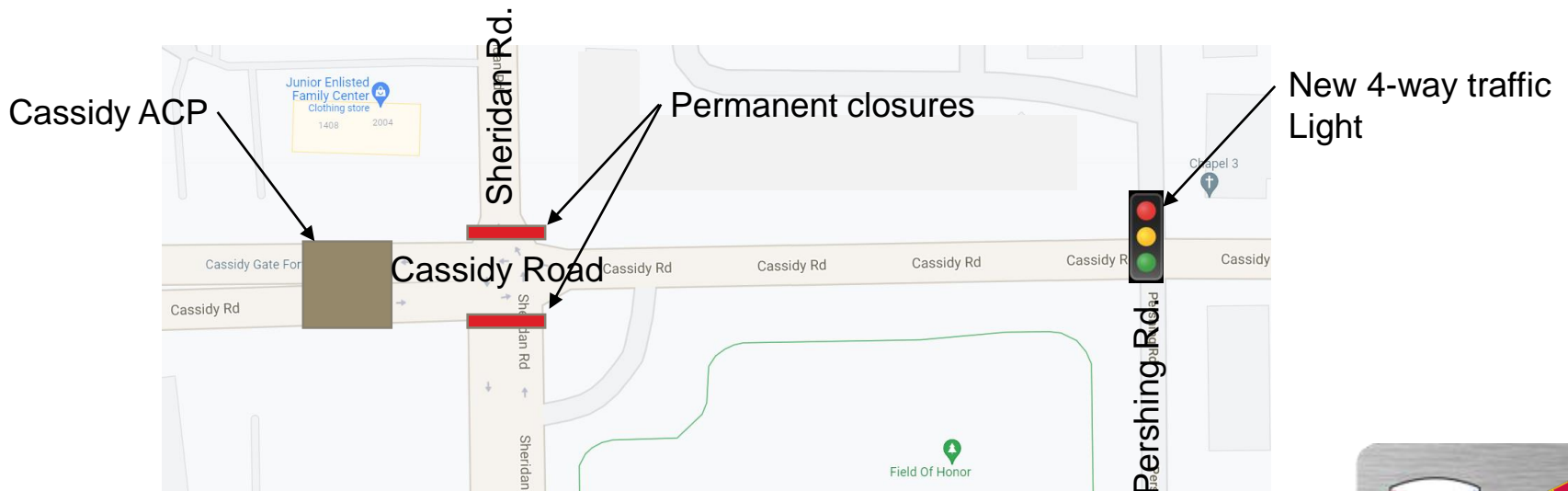




Upcoming Road Improvements

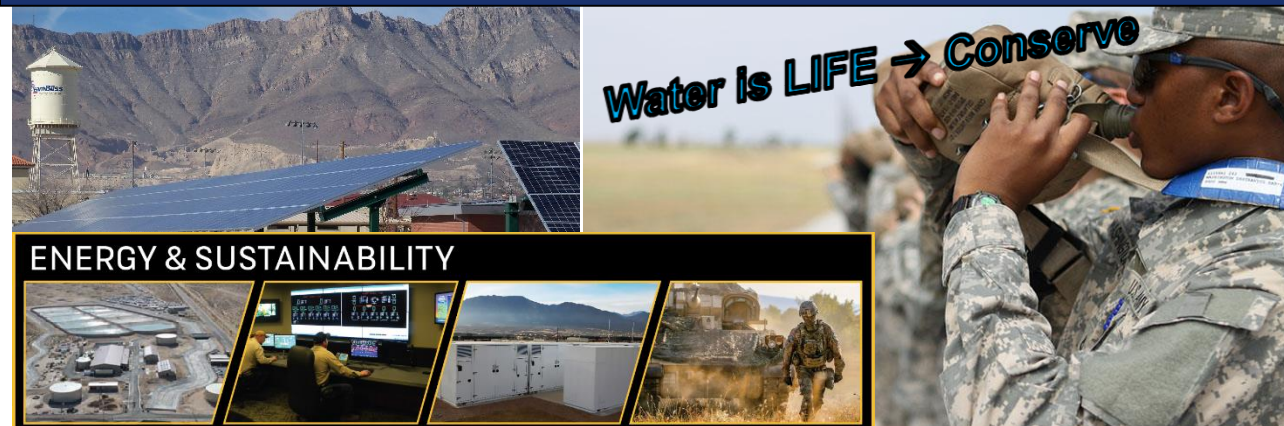

Army Housing Office (AHO)

The Fort Bliss AHO serves as your Military Tenant Advocate!

- The AHO staff is employed by the Army to assist Service Members and their Families with housing matters and advocate on their behalf with community partners/agencies on and off post
- Housing Service Office (HSO) provides referral services and tenant/landlord dispute services for off-post leases
- Residential Communities Initiative (RCI) provides oversight of the privatized company, Balfour Beatty Communities (BBC) managing on-post housing and provides tenant/landlord dispute services for on-post leases
- Unaccompanied Housing (UH) provides oversight of the Army Barracks Management Program (ABMP)
- Army Housing Chief manages the AHO and reports directly to the Director, Public Works and Garrison leadership

Housing Services Office (HSO)

Important Information to Remember

- ✓ The HSO staff provides Service Members and Families with off-post housing counseling and referral assistance. Contact the HSO Office when you have questions about housing at any installation
 - Responsible for in/out-processing, review entitlements, provide a full range of Community Home search, Relocation, and Referral Services
 - Review, clarify and explain lease contracts upon request
 - Mediate tenant/landlord disputes
 - Manage Rental Partnership Program (RPP)
 - Liaison with Army Community Services in support of the Housing Relocation Assistance Program
 - Process Exception to Policy (ETP) as required for local moves due to foreclosure
 - Service Member Civil Relief Act (SCRA)... know your rights!





HSO Cont.

Important Information to Remember

Off-Post Rentals

- Submit termination notice in writing to your property manager
 - 30 days prior to termination
 - Attach a copy of Orders
 - Schedule your pre/final inspections
- The lease will be terminated 30 days after the date on which your next rental payment is due under the (SCRA) military clause
- Ensure all debt has been cleared with the property manager
- Please provide a forwarding address to the property manager
- Security deposits can't be used as your last month's rent
- Any damages you caused during your tenancy will be deducted from your security deposit and the balance refunded to you
- You must follow the instructions in your lease to get your security deposit refunded
- Security deposits are to be returned to you between 14 to 30 days of terminating your lease





Residential Communities Initiative (RCI)

We are your Advocate

- RCI manages the partnership between the Government and BBC, provides oversight of homes owned by BBC
- Privatized Housing Quality Assurance (QA) & Environmental Hazard Oversight
- National Defense Authorization Act - an annual congressional bill giving guidance on the policies and funding of defense agencies
- Tenant Bill of Rights and Responsibilities – 18 privatized housing tenants rights and responsibilities
- Mediates disputes between BBC and tenants
- Provide Plain Language Briefing - Briefed to all residents of privatized housing prior to lease signing and again 30 days after move-in on all rights and responsibilities associated with tenancy of the housing unit





Unaccompanied Housing (UH)

Army Barracks Management Program (ABMP)

- Barracks residents are required to comply with Senior Commander's **Policy Letters # 4 and 11. Read it! Know it!**
- Single Service Members (bona fide bachelors) PVT-SGT are mandatorily assigned to barracks IAW AR 420-1, CH 3
- Service Member married to Service Member without joint domicile when one is assigned to a different installation, are housed as single Service Members and will not collect BAH unless the other Service Member has orders to arrive within 120 days
- Pregnant E-1 to E-5 Service Members are required to obtain an Exception to Policy (ETP). Service Member does not have to wait until the 3rd trimester of the pregnancy to receive a CNA for BAH at the without Dependent rate
