



✓ Visitor Policy Updates

- Now allow **one (1) visitor** and/or escort per patient at any given time
- Patients at risk for imminent death (within 24 hours): Allowed up to four (4) visitors at any given time.
- Laboring or Post-Partum Patients: Parent or legal guardian may bring newborns and infants (18 months or younger) to an appointment if necessary
- Face Covering/Mask Required: Patients and visitors should wear their own well-fitting form of source control (face mask) upon arrival to and throughout their stay in the facility. Face masks should not be placed on children under age 2 years, anyone who cannot wear one safely, or anyone who is unconscious or is incapacitated





Vaccination Updates

What Vaccine is Available?

- 1. We are currently administering the <u>Pfizer-Biotech</u> COVID-19 vaccine to all eligible beneficiaries (ages 12 years and older), DoD Civilians, and DoD Contractors.
- 2. The Moderna vaccine is currently designated to support 2nd dose vaccinations for mobilizing individuals who received their first dose at their home station prior to arriving at Fort Bliss.
- The Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine is not available at the moment. This is currently reserved the DoD is planned to be utilized in our austere locations for deployed and shipboard forces.

Vaccine Location by Age Group

Ages 12-17 years old: Appointment Only

Please make an **appointment** to receive your vaccine **at Stout Gym**. The Freedom Crossing vaccination site cannot accommodate this age group due to staffing limitations. A parent or legal guardian is required to be present at the site to provide consent for vaccination.

Ages 18 years and older: Appointment or Walk-in

For individuals age 18 year older, you may make an appointment to receive your vaccine at Stout Gym. **Walk-ins** are accepted **at** the **Freedom Crossing** vaccination site located next to Military Clothing Sales.

What to bring to receive my vaccine?

- 4. DHA Form 207 May 2021 version

- 2. DD Form 2870 (Authorization For Disclosure of Medical or Dental Information) – Completed & signed *This is also required for ALL GS, contractors,

and volunteers so that APHN can enter the information into MEDPROS and AHLTA.

3. Drop off copy of Proof of Vaccination and Completed DD Form 2870 **at STOUT GYM** during operating hours

Please ensure your proof of vaccination includes the following information:

- Manufacturer
- Lot number
- Dose
- Route
- Injection site
- Date the vaccine was given

Early years (1849-1892)

From its beginnings in 1849, 1898) the medical units that supported the Army installation in El Paso have moved several times. In January 1854, "The Post of El Paso del Norte", was established on Magoffin's Ranch. Remains of the original Army Hospital located at Hart's Mill were uncovered General's Office.

Formative years (1893-

permanent hospital at Fort Bliss in support of a permanent regimental post along the border. This building, now known as Building 8, is currently the location of the Fort Bliss Inspector

by archaeologists in 2012 near the main campus of University of Texas

Civil War – under control of Confederate Army (1861 - 1862)

At El Paso.

Fort Bliss and the hospital remained Confederate until 20 Aug 1862. The retreating had fallen into disrepair. Confederate troops destroyed all of Fort Bliss, except for the hospital, which housed their sick and wounded.

The 1890s saw the establishment of a

Spanish–American War (1898–1902)

During this period, the hospital supported a skeletal garrison at Fort Bliss, containing never more than 100 Soldiers. By 1902 the hospital, along with all the buildings on Fort Bliss,

New Fort Bliss Post Hospital (1903–1919)

The new Post Hospital building was completed in 1904. The first Army dental training school was established at the Fort Bliss Post Hospital in September 1916 by Captain Robert T. Oliver.

World War II and after (1940-1968)

William Beaumont General Hospital served as one of many prisoner-of-war hospitals across the United States that supported the prisoner-of-war camps at Fort Bliss and surrounding camps during World War II. During early 1945, approximately 6,000 inpatients were treated.

William Beaumont Army Medical Center (1969–March 2021)

In 1969, the Army began construction of a new, 12-story hospital to the west of the WBGH area. Completed in 1972, the new facility became known as the William Beaumont Army Medical Center. Although originally designed for 611 beds, the hospital had a bed capacity for more than 150 patients; during contingencies, the hospital could expand for 373 patients. As the Southwest's major regional Army medical center, this facility provided medical care to active and retired military personnel and their dependents as well as Veteran beneficiaries in the three-state region of Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona.

The Emergency Department is located on the 1st floor of the Hospital Tower.

Hospital Tower

Hospital services are located in the Hospital Tower. The 7-story tower will contain: 10 Operating Rooms 135 patient beds to include the following: 16 Intensive care (ICU) 48 Medical & Surgical 16 Labor & Delivery 24 Mother & Baby 23 Behavioral Health 8 Post Anesthesia Care

Amenities

Patients, visitors, and staff will have access to these and other amenities throughout the facility.

Dining Facility: 1st floor of the Hospital Tower with seating throughout the center entrance.

Dept. of Ministry and Chaplain Services: 1st floor of the Hospital Tower with access to the Exterior Chapel Meditation Garden.

Conference Rooms: Several conference rooms are located throughout the hospital, two of which are also co-located within the Dining Facility seating area.

Outdoor Courtyards: There are several outdoor courtyards located behind the center entrance and between the clinic towers.



What can you do to assist with controlling Feral, Stray or Wild Animals?

Evidence of residents feeding feral cats were observed on Ft Bliss within the Housing Areas. Feral cats, and food provided to feral, stray and wild animals, are attractants and food sources for coyotes and other wild animals.

Please:

- DO NOT feed feral, stray, or wild animals.
- DO NOT confront, approach, or corner any animals, as they may perceive it as a threat.
- DO NOT leave pets, pet food, food scraps, or trash outdoors and available to animals.
- **REPORT** all sightings to the Service Order Desk.
- **REMEMBER** feral cats are prey items for coyotes, attracting them to residential areas.
- For aggressive animals, ALWAYS notify first the Ft. Bliss Military Police at (915) 568-2115






دهه Cassidy/Sheridan/Pershing Rd. Improvements



Many Single Soldiers are unaware of the BOSS program, as their units do not have representatives.


- Please ensure your units all have a BOSS representative who will brief the Single Soldiers and maintain a board with flyers we provide.




